## CHEMICAL IN MILK

There is a recent story in the Wall Street Journal which reported that dicyandiamide (DCD), a product that farmers apply to pastures to reduce nitrate leaching and promote pasture growth, has been found in milk in New Zealand. New Zealand media reported that two fertilizer companies recalled their products containing the active ingredient. New Zealand media also quoted Fonterra sources saving that the product does not present a food safety risk. A ministry of the government official said there is no food safety concern associated with the use of DCD.
